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*LEFT DISLOCATION IN NORWEGIAN*

*The aim of this paper is to focus on one of the special linguistic features of the Norwegian language: the phenomenon of the left dislocation. In syntax, dislocation is a sentence structure in which a constituent which could otherwise be either an argument or an adjunct of the clause occurs outside the clause boundaries to its left side. This construction is much used in the Norwegian language. The syntactic phenomenon of the left dislocation appears in German and Bulgarian also.*

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
