*RECEPTION OF SØREN KIERKEGAARD'S WORKS
IN THE SOFIA UNIVERSITY LIBRARY*

This article offers an overview of the reception of the works of the Danish philosopher and theologian Søren Aabye Kierkegaard (1813–1855) – one of the most influential representatives of the humanist philosophy in the 19th century. Despite the fact that few Bulgarian readers can read the texts in their original language, Kierkegaard's ideas are mostly known through Russian, German and French translations. A look inside the University Library catalogs reveals the extent of reception of Kierkegaard's writings in the university and informs us about many comments and analyses of the writings of the famous philosopher.
